Meson Spectroscopy





Discretise on a grid (spacing = a) – regulator

Finite volume \rightarrow finite no. of d.o.f.







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definite J^P

$$C_{ij}(t) = \sum_{n} \frac{e^{-E_n t}}{2E_n} < 0|\mathcal{O}_i(0)|n > < n|\mathcal{O}_j^{\dagger}(0)|0 >$$

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 \rightarrow discrete spectrum



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$$\mathcal{O}(\vec{P}) = \sum_{\vec{p}_1, \ \vec{p}_2} \mathcal{C}_{\Lambda}(\vec{P}, \vec{p}_1, \vec{p}_2) \ \mathcal{O}_{\pi}(\vec{p}_1) \ \mathcal{O}_{\pi}(\vec{p}_2)$$



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Extract phase shift at discrete $p_{\rm cm}$

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Map out phase shift \rightarrow resonance parameters (mass, width)
