Motivations

- The knowledge of conductor mechanical properties is fundamental to study winding deformations
- we have full information on LHC cable (different insulation and no stainless steel strip inside Rutherford)
- no mechanical information on SIS300 cable

we need to measure the mechanical behavior of our conductor

Stacking tests: sample description

- We are going to prepare (using LHC cable):
 - 2 stacks of 12 conductor 16.5 cm long to be measured in compression at ASG
 - 2 stacks of 10 conductors 10 cm long to be measured in compression at LASA
 - 2 stacks of 6 conductors 16.5 cm long to be measured in tension (longitudinally) at LASA
- If needed, more samples made with the LHC cable will follow
- Once the procedure is established, we will start preparing samples using the GSI cable

LHC conductor insulation

azimuthal thickness (s _y)	141.6 μm	98 μ m
	<u>-5.6%</u>	<u>-21.6%</u>

•We can foresee a discrepancy between our measurements and the given dimensions of SIS300 cable
