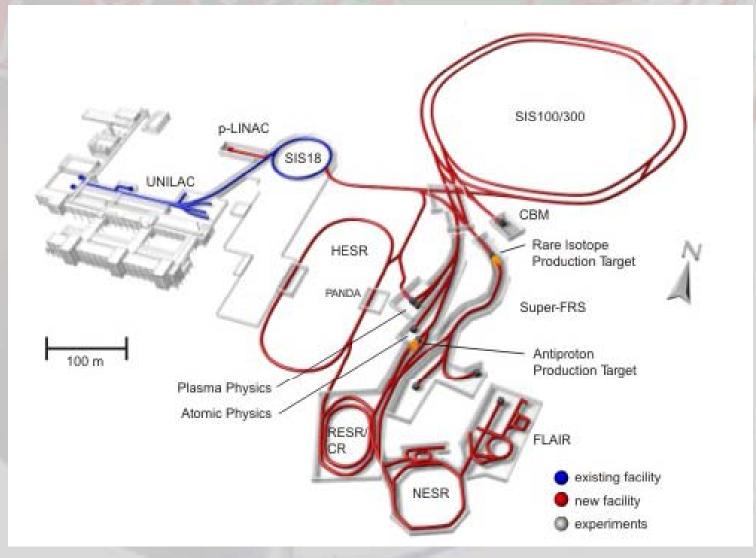

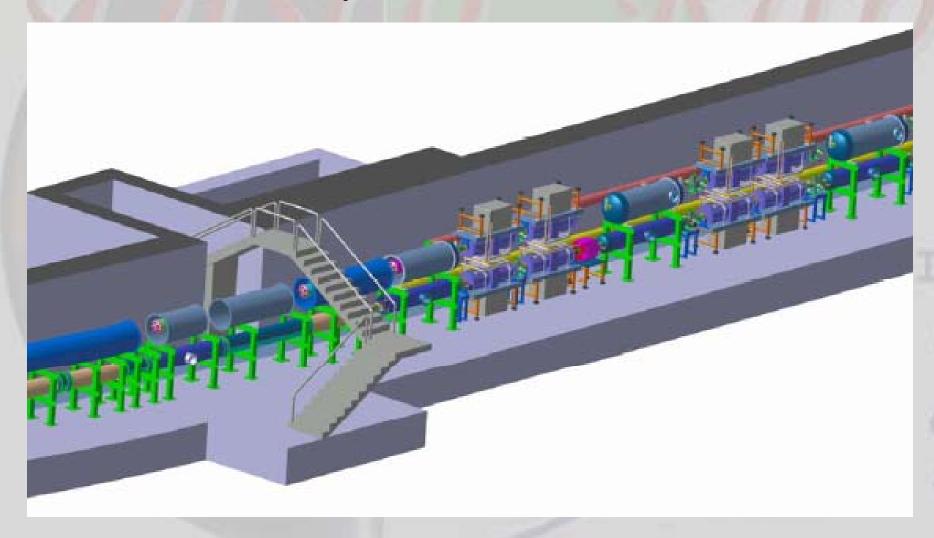
48 long dipoles – Magnetic length 7.89 m 12 short dipoles – Magnetic length 3.94 m

Criticity of SIS300 dipoles: why R&D is needed?

Ac losses depend on **B** and **dB/dt**. The heat generated shall be efficiently removed for **avoiding premature quenching**. The ac losses shall be kept at a minimum level for keeping the cryogenic costs at an acceptable level

The curvature of R=66.667 m (sagitta 117 mm) produces a **significant** manufacturing complexity (consider that for reducing ac losses the conductor is quite stiff)

The magnets shall be cycled 10 million times → Design optimised for fatigue loads





The R&D DISCORAP

The Italian National Institute of Nuclear Physics (INFN) is performing an R&D activity aimed to develop fast cycled superconducting dipole for FAIR SIS300.

This activity, named DISCORAP ("Dipoli SuperCOnduttori RApidamente Pulsati"), started in 2006 in accordance with a specific INFN-FAIR Memorandum of Understanding signed by both institutions in December 2006. The aim is to have a complete cold mass model of the short dipole ready in the summer of 2009. After a preliminary test of the cold mass in a vertical cryostat, it will be integrated into a horizontal cryostat for a test series at GSI.

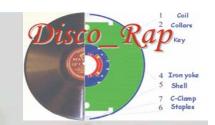




The Technical Design Report

An important milestone has been recently achieved with the completion of both the technical design of the model magnet and of the industrial developments preliminary to the construction of the model. A document was finalized: the TDR, which in draft form has been issued and is now scrutinized.





Motivations for this review

The model magnet represents a test bench in view of the construction of the real fast cycled curved sc dipole magnet for SIS300. If the constructive technologies and the technical solutions adopted for the model are successfully, the next step will be the realization of models/prototypes, preliminary to the mass production.

In this framework, it is important to have an external opinion by experts of the field about the basic technical choices, the lay-out, the materials involved, the analyses done, at this stage of the R&D activities, before the construction of cold mass starts.

Five questions to the review committee

The Review Committee has received a draft version of the TECHNICAL DESIGN REPORT OF THE SUPERCONDUCTING MODEL DIPOLE FOR FAIR SIS300 (TDR).

On the basis of the information given in the TDR and in this review the Review Committee shall answer to the following questions:

- 1) Is the design of the model correct with relation to the required ac operations?
- 2) Is the conductor properly designed?
- 3) Are the FE analyses complete or some aspects are missing?
- 4)Are the preliminary industrial developments exhaustive or further tests are recommended?
- 5)Is the present design a solid basis for finalizing the design of SIS300 dipoles or other possibilities should be investigated before (or during) the construction future prototypes?
