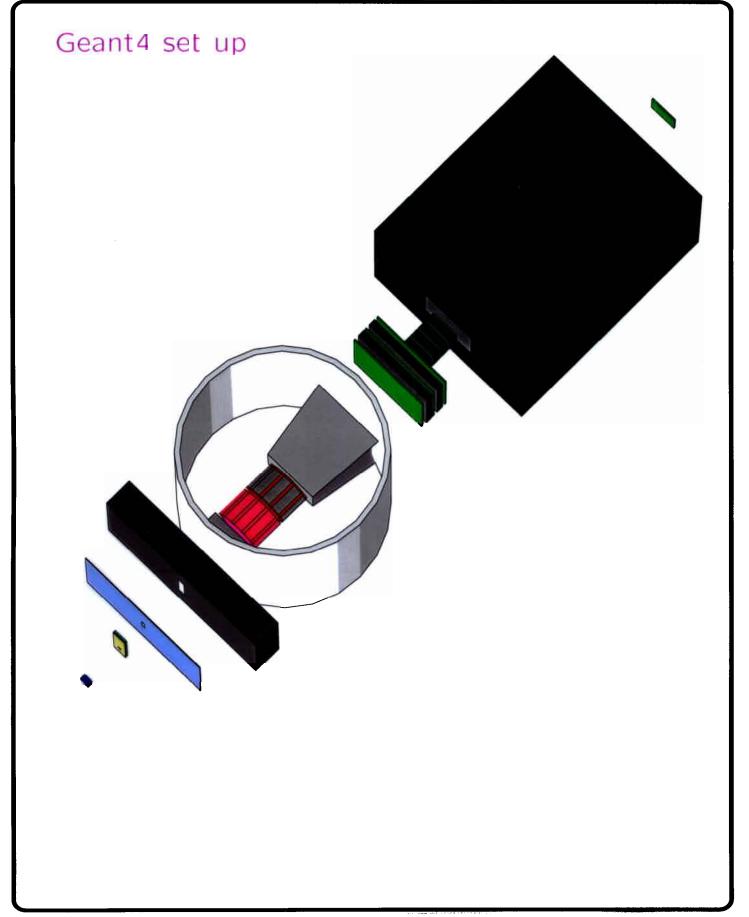
Comparison of Experimental Electron Signals with GEANT3 and GEANT4 Simulations for the ATLAS Forward Calorimeter Prototype

Test Beam set up in Geant4

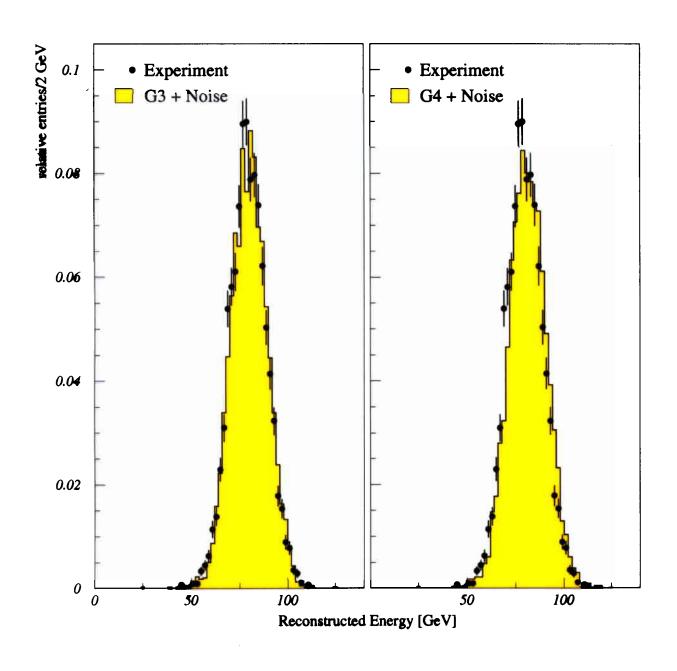


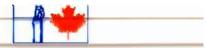

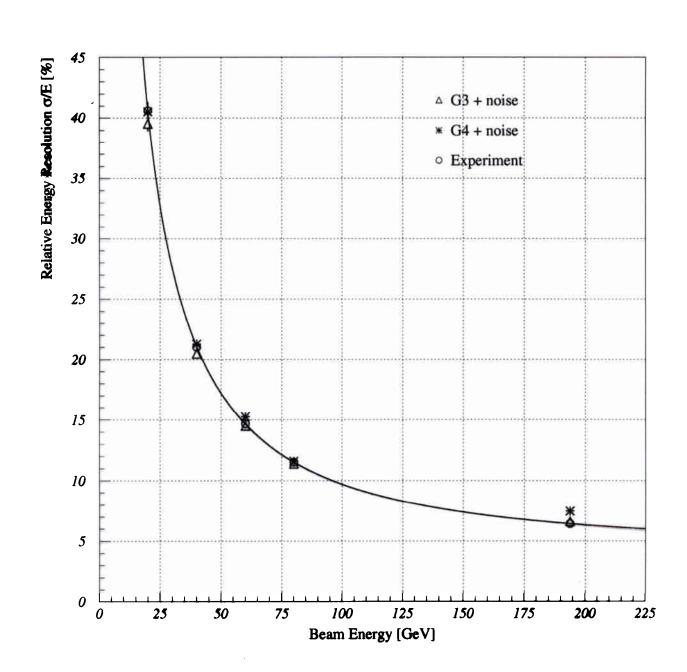
80 GeV Electron Signal Distributions







FCall Election Energy Resolution



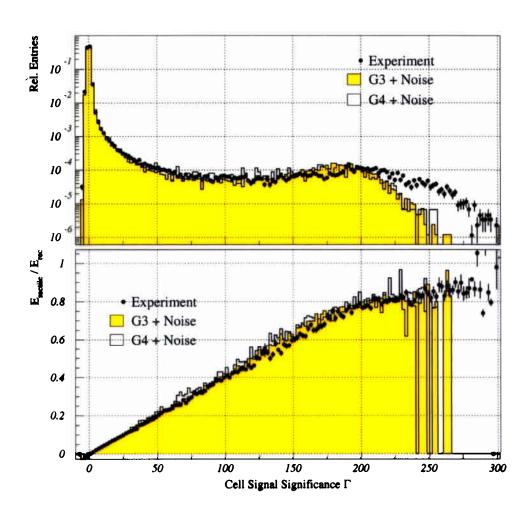
No noise cut, no cylinder cut.

Conclusion



Conclusion and Outlook

- comparison of Geant3 and Geant4 for FCAL1 Modille 0 snows a good agreement for both signal and energy resolution.
- adding noise to simulated data at cell level produces a rather good agreement between data and Monte Carlo for global; energy sums and resolution, at the level of (few) percent;
- Secondary tracks produced with a low range cut should be investigated. Possible problem with 0.005mm cut!
- detailed comparisons of shower developpemet show some problems for both Geant3 and Geant4
- more studies are done to understand the signal significance: geometry effects (FCAL angle, experimental data misalignement), shower more soft in MC...
- Geant4 compares relatively well to the experimental data and is much faster;
- Hadrons study are the next challenge!

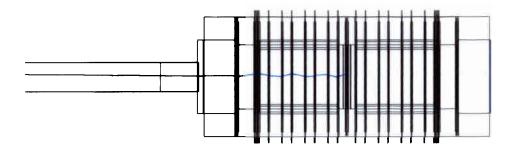

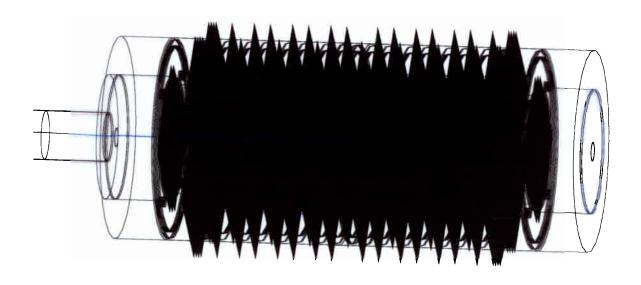
Michel Parameters in Muon Decay

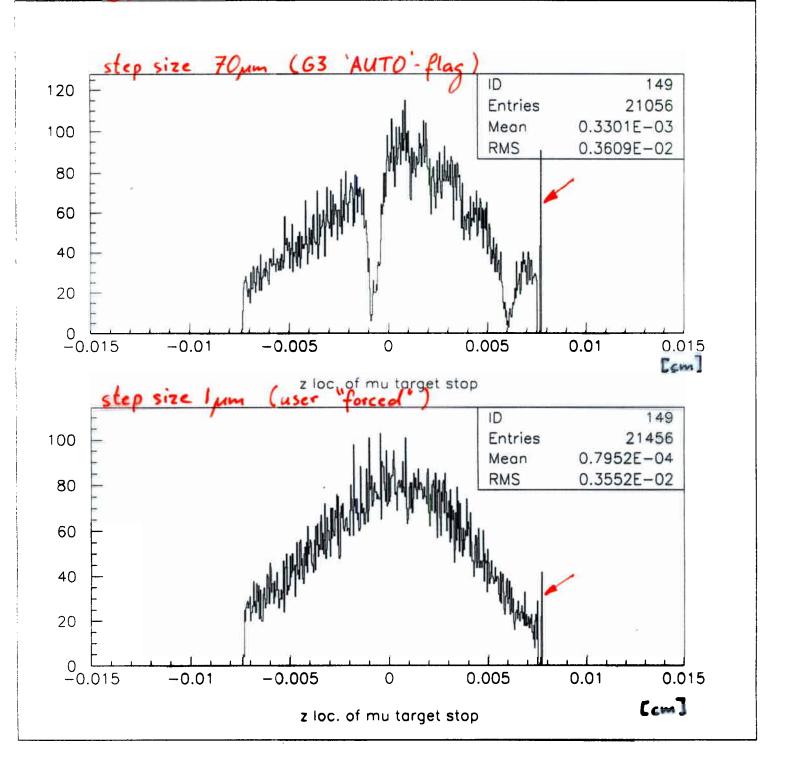

- Coop student project [SFU]
- Simulation: complete TWIST detector geometry definition; functionality at the level of E614GEANT (G3) except for hit collection and digitization.
- Goal: range out 29.6MeV/c surface muons after many thin mylar layers in a thin (~150um) Al stopping target by way of extra plastic and He/CO2 gas degrader.
- Result: Small steps required in G3 (user optimization) to avoid unphysical results due to tracking cut in energy, while in G4 only one step is taken in the stopping volume due to superior tracking cut on the particle's range.

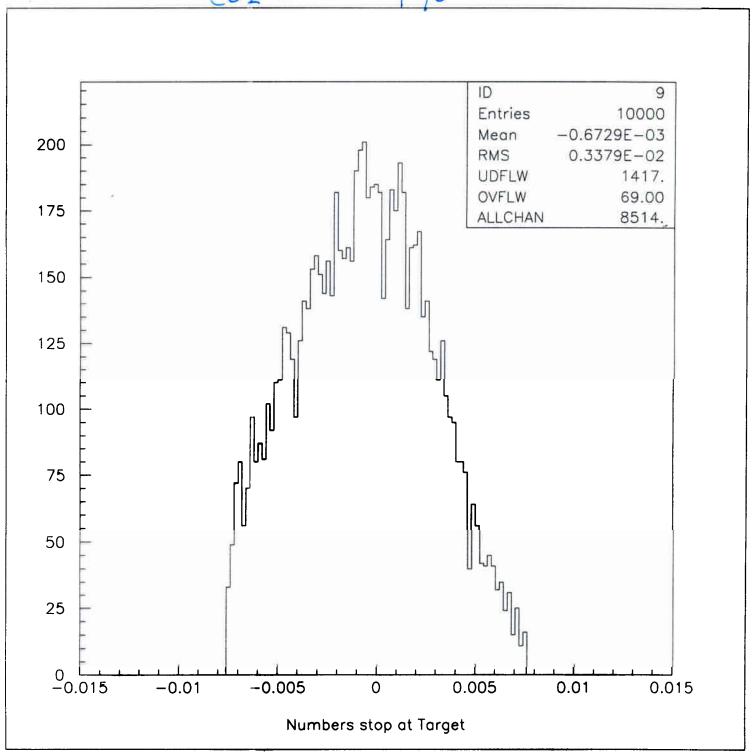


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Plastic thichness 0.014 cm CO2 Content 70%

Muon Scattering in Low Z Materials [R. Edgecock, P. Gumplinger, G. Marshall, B. Murray]

- Motivation: Existing data suggests discrepancy with Moliere Theory at large scattering angle; gets worse for low Z elements (problematic in case of hydrogen - muon ionization cooling factor may not be achieved).
- Experiment: measure muon multiple scattering and energy loss correlation for: liq. Hydrogen, LiH, lithium, beryllium, aluminum, stainless steel.
- Goal: (1) Compare results with basic mult. scattering models (based on Moliere Th.) as implemented in G4.
 (2) Distinguish between subtle variations (i.e. using hydrogen wave functions vs. Thomas-Fermi model).
- Result: directly feed back to the G4 collaboration
