The experimental program on the studies of N\* structure in exclusive meson electroproduction with CLAS seeks to determine:

- γ<sub>v</sub>NN\* electrocouplings at photon virtualities up to 5.0 GeV<sup>2</sup> for most of the excited proton states through analyzing major meson electroproduction channels independently and in global multi-channel analyses;
- extend available knowledge on resonance hadronic decays in particular for the multi-meson final states.

This information allows us to explore the evolution of different degrees of freedom in the N\* structure with distance and to access the nonperturbative strong interaction which generates N\* states as bound systems of quarks and gluons (I. G. Aznauryuan et al., Int. J. Mod. Phys. E22, 133015 (2013)).



#### Access to γ<sub>v</sub>NN\* Electrocouplings from the Data on Exclusive Meson Electroproduction



 Consistent results on γ<sub>v</sub>NN\* electrocouplings from different meson electroproduction channels and different analysis approaches demonstrate reliable extraction of these quantities.

Nπ/Nππ channels are major sources of information on  $\gamma_v$ NN\* electrocouplings.

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# The CLAS Data on $\pi^+\pi^-p$ Differential Cross Sections and their Fit within the Framework of Meson-Baryon Model JM



- Coherent superposition of π<sup>-</sup>Δ<sup>++</sup>, π<sup>+</sup>Δ<sup>0</sup>, ρp, π<sup>+</sup> N<sup>0</sup> (1520)D<sub>13</sub>, π<sup>-</sup>Δ<sup>++</sup> (1600)P<sub>33</sub>, π<sup>+</sup>N<sup>0</sup>(1680)F<sub>15</sub> meson-baryon channels and direct 2π production amplitudes without formation of unstable hadrons in the intermediate states.
- Resonant amplitudes described by unitarized Briet-Wigner ansatz and contribute to  $\pi\Delta$  and  $\rho p$  channels only. All N\* -states of 4-star RPP status are included.
- Current conserving, reggeized Born terms plus extra-contact terms for description of non-resonant πΔ amplitudes. The absorptive ansatz for phenomenological ISI & FSI treatment.
- Diffractive ansatz for non-resonant  $\rho p$  amplitudes accounting for  $\rho$ -line shrinkage in N\*-excitation region.
- The amplitudes of  $\pi^+ N^0$  (1520)D<sub>13</sub> channel are derived from those of  $\pi\Delta$  channel implementing  $\gamma_5$ -matrix to p- $\pi$  -N<sup>0</sup> (1520)D<sub>13</sub> vertex with magnitudes fit to the data.
- The amplitudes of  $\pi^{-}\Delta^{++}$  (1600)P<sub>33</sub>,  $\pi^{+}$  N<sup>0</sup>(1680)F<sub>15</sub> channels are parameterized by contact terms with magnitudes fit to the data.
- Parameterizations of direct 2π production amplitudes were established examining the correlations between the shapes of their contributions to different 1-fold differential cross sections.

Major objectives: extraction of  $\gamma_v NN^*$  electrocouplings and  $\pi\Delta$ ,  $\rho p$  decay widths fitting all available observables of  $\pi^+\pi^-p$  exclusive channel.

#### **Unitarized Breit-Wigner Ansatz for Resonant Amplitudes**

Resonant amplitude : 
$$T_{\gamma p \rightarrow MB}^{res} = f_{\beta MB} S_{\alpha \beta} f_{\alpha \gamma p}$$



Inverse of the JM unitarized N\* propagator:

Full resonant amplitude of unitarized Breit-Wigner ansatz is consistent with restrictions imposed by a general unitarity condition.

#### Accounting for the ISI & FSI in $\pi\Delta$ Channels



Absorptive ansatz proposed in K.Gottfried, J.D.Jackson, Nuovo Cimento 34, 736 (1964) and developed for the use in the JM model in M.Ripani et al., Nucl Phys. A672, 220 (2000).

Non-resonant parts of  $\pi\Delta$  amplitudes computed from tree diagrams  $T^{J\,tree}_{\ \lambda u}$  are multiplied by the absorptive factors in the initial an final states f<sup>J</sup><sub>ISI</sub>, f<sup>J</sup><sub>FSI</sub>:

**Possible improvement:** absorptive ansatz can be replaced by the results of coupled channel analyses on the ratio R:  $\pi\Delta$  (photo) electroproduction amplitudes accounting for FSI T<sup>J full</sup>  $_{\pi\Delta}$  over their values computed from tree diagrams T <sup>J tree</sup>  $_{\pi\Lambda}$ :

# The Phases of Direct $2\pi$ Production Amplitudes from the CLAS data on $\alpha$ -angular distributions



Good description of all available data at W < 1.8 GeV and 0.25<Q<sup>2</sup><1.5 GeV<sup>2</sup> was achieved with  $\chi^2$ /d.p. <3.0.

Major restriction: considerable contributions from the mechanisms parameterized phenomenologicaly without access to explicit meson-baryon or quark-gluon processes behind the phenomenology.

Further model developments: the JM's non-resonant mechanisms can be improved by using  $2\rightarrow 2$ ,  $2\rightarrow 3$ , and  $3\rightarrow 3$  amplitudes describing electroproduction of the intermediate/ final states and generated from the effective Lagrangians of the ANL-Osaka dynamical coupled-channel model (H. Kamano et al., arXiv:1305.4351[nucl-th], to appear in PRC).

#### **Fitting Procedures and Uncertainty Estimates**

Simultaneous non-restricted variation of the following resonant/non-resonant JM model parameters according to the normal distribution:

 $-\gamma_v$ NN\* electrocouplings with  $\sigma$ -parameter equal to 30% from their initial values;

-  $\pi\Delta$  and  $\rho$ p hadronic decays for the N\*-states under studies with  $\sigma$ -parameters, that cause total N\* width float slightly above RPP ranges;

-magnitudes of extra-contact terms in  $\pi\Delta$  channels; magnitudes of the amplitudes of  $\pi^+ N^0(1520) D_{13}$ ,  $\pi^+ N^0(1680) F_{15}$ ,  $\pi^- \Delta^{++}(1620) P_{33}$  channels and of the direct  $2\pi$  production amplitudes with  $\sigma$ -parameters 10 -30 % from their starting values.

- $\chi^2$ /d.p. fit of nine 1-fold diff. cross sections in each bin of W and Q<sup>2</sup>. Closest to the data computed cross sections were selected with  $\chi^2$ /d.p. <  $\chi^2$ /d.p. <sub>thr</sub>., which was defined so that selected in the fit cross sections should be inside the uncertainties for most of the data points.
- Mean values of N\* parameters resulting to the selected in the fit computed cross and their r.m.s were assigned to resonance parameters inferred from the data and their uncertainties, respectively.

Consistent results on  $P_{11}(1440)$  and  $D_{13}(1520)$  electrocouplings determined independently from  $N\pi$  and  $\pi^{+}\pi^{-}$  p electroproduction strongly support <u>reliable electrocoupling extraction</u>.

Access to bare  $\gamma_v NN^*$  electrocouplings is needed in order to compare extracted from the data N\* parameters with the results of quark models and the Dyson-Schwinger Equations of QCD. LQCD will allow us to confront dressed N\*-parameters with expectations on full PW amplitudes evaluated starting from the QCD Lagrangian.

• Restriction: N\* hadronic parameters should be the same at different photon virtualities Q<sup>2</sup>.

• The CLAS  $\pi^+\pi^-p$  electroproduction data extended available knowledge on hadronic decays of high-mass resonances.

# **Conclusions and Outlook**

- High quality π<sup>+</sup>π<sup>-</sup>p electroproduction data from the CLAS allowed us to determine electrocouplings of most resonances in the mass range W<1.8 GeV and at photon virtualities Q<sup>2</sup><1.5 GeV<sup>2</sup> for the first time.
- Consistent results on electrocouplings of  $P_{11}(1440)$  and  $D_{13}(1520)$  states obtained from independent analyses of  $N\pi/N\pi\pi$  channels confirmed reliable extraction of these fundamental quantities and capability of the JM model for the reliable extraction of resonance parameters.
- The resonant/non-resonant amplitudes of the meson-baryon channels derived from the fit of the  $\pi^+\pi^-p$  electroproduction data can be employed in a global multi-channel analyses of meson photo-, electro-, and hadroproduction data.
- Electrocouplings of most N\*-states in mass range up to 2.0 GeV will be determined in few years from independent analyses of N $\pi$  and N $\pi\pi$  electroproduction at Q<sup>2</sup><5.0 GeV<sup>2</sup>, allowing us to explore the evolution of resonance structure with the excited state quantum numbers at the distances where the transition to dominance of quark degrees of freedom occurs.

The unique combination of the CEBAF continuous electron beam and the CLAS detector makes Hall-B@JLAB the only facility operational worldwide, that is capable of measuring unpolarized cross sections and polarization asymmetries of most exclusive meson electroproduction channels with substantial contributions at W<3.0 GeV and Q<sup>2</sup><5.0 GeV<sup>2</sup>.

#### Need for Further Improvements in Description of Direct $2\pi$ Production



#### Integrated Cross Sections of the Meson-Baryon Channels Contributing to $\pi^+\pi^-p$ Electroproduction



- $\pi^{-}\Delta^{++}$  meson-baryon channel accounts for the major part of  $\pi^{+}\pi^{-}p$  electroproduction cross section. Relative resonant contribution to  $\pi^{-}\Delta^{++}$  channel increases with Q<sup>2</sup>.
- The meson-baryon channels incorporated into the JM model becomes relevant in the following W-areas:

2π direct production decreases substantially at W from 1.5 to 1.7 GeV offering an indication for sizable transition amplitudes between the final π<sup>+</sup>π<sup>-</sup>p state and open meson-baryon channels.



Simultaneous non-restricted variation of the following resonant/non-resonant JM model parameters according to the normal distribution:

 $-\gamma_v$ NN\* electrocouplings with  $\sigma$ -parameter equal to 30% from their initial values, taken from interpolation of the CLAS/world data;

- $\pi\Delta$  and  $\rho p$  hadronic decays decomposed over LS p.w for part of N\*'s with  $\sigma$ -parameters, that cause total N\* width float slightly above RPP ranges;

-magnitudes of complementary contact terms in  $\pi\Delta$  isobar channels; magnitudes of the  $\pi^+D_{13}^0(1520)$ ,  $\pi^+F_{15}^0(1685)$ ,  $\pi^-P^{++}_{33}(1620)$  isobar channel amplitudes; magnitudes of direct  $2\pi$  production mechanisms ; the respective  $\sigma$ -parameters were chosen 10 -30 % from the starting magnitude values

•  $\chi^2$ /d.p. fit of nine 1-fold diff. cross sections in each bin of W and Q<sup>2</sup> were carried out. Closest to the data calculated cross sections were selected with  $\chi^2$ /d.p. <  $\chi^2$ /d.p.<sub>thr</sub>. The  $\chi^2$ /d.p.<sub>thr</sub>. were defined so that selected in the fit calculated cross sections are inside the uncertainties of measured cross sections for a major part of the data points.

#### Quark Core vs Meson-Baryon Cloud in the Structure of P<sub>11</sub>(1440)



First evaluation of the quark core contribution to the  $P_{11}(1440)$  electrocouplings starting from QCD Lagrangian within Dyson-Schwinger Equations of QCD:

•Poincare-covariant, symmetry preserving DSEQCD evaluation.

•Account for quark mass/structure formation in dressing of bare quark by gluon cloud.

•Simplified contact interaction generates momentum independent quark mass.

Consistent results on the quark core contribution from:

DSEQCD. global meson photo-, electro-, and hadroproduction data analysis within EBAC/ Argonne-Osaka approach.

$$m_q^{bare} = 0.007 GeV \Rightarrow m_q^{dressed} = 0.368 GeV$$

Measured dressed electrocouplings are substantially different from the estimated quark core contribution. Different data analyses suggest sizable meson-baryon cloud at  $Q^2$ <5.0 GeV<sup>2</sup> which gradually decreases with  $Q^2$ .

#### **Resonance Transitions with the CLAS12**

Resonance electrocouplings in regime of quark core dominance can be related to the running quark masses and their dynamical structure.

12 GeV experiment E12-09-003 will extend access to electrocouplings for all prominent N\* states in the range up to  $Q^2=12GeV^2$ .

Probe the transition from confinement to pQCD regimes, allowing us to explore how confinement in baryons emerge from QCD and how >98 % of baryon masses are generated non-perturbatively via dynamical chiral symmetry breaking.

# Impact of the Recent LQCD studies of N\* Spectrum and Structure on the N\* Program with CLAS/CLAS12

J.J.Dudek, R.G.Edwards, Phys. Rev. D85, 054016 (2012).

•each N\* state with  $M_{N^*} < 1.8 \text{ GeV}$ has partner in computed LQCD spectrum, but level ordering is not always consistent to the data

•wave functions of the low-lying  $\tilde{\mathfrak{s}}_{2.0}$ N\* states dominate by 1-2 SU(6) configurations, while the wave function of high lying N\*'s may <sup>1.5</sup> contain many SU(6) configurations

•presence of hybrid-N\*s with dominant contribution of hybrid components at  $M_{N*}$ >1.9 GeV marked by



New direction in N\* studies proposed in V.D.Burkert, arXiv:1203.2373 [nucl-ex]: Search for hybrid N\*-states looking for:

>overpopulation of SU(6)-multiplet;

### **Transition N-P<sub>11</sub>(1440) form factors in LQCD**

Includes the quark loops in the sea , which are critical in order to reproduce the CLAS data at  $Q^2$ <1.0 GeV<sup>2</sup>



•Exploratory LQCD results provide reasonable description of the CLAS data from the QCD Lagrangian.

•Prospects for LQCD evaluation with improved projection operators, approaching physical mp in the box of appropriate size.

 $\gamma_v$ NN\* Electrocouplings: A Unique Window into the Quark Structure

Data on  $\gamma_v NN^*$  electrocouplings from E12-09-003 experiment (Q<sup>2</sup> > 5 GeV<sup>2</sup>) will afford for the first time direct access to the non-perturbative strong interaction among dressed quarks, their emergence from QCD, and the subsequent N\* formation.

#### Anticipated N\* Electrocouplings from data on N $\pi$ & N $\pi\pi$ electroproduction



Open circles represent projections and all other markers the available results with the 6-GeV electron beam

> Examples of published and projected results obtained within 60d for three prominent excited proton states from analyses of N $\pi$  and N $\pi\pi$  electroproduction channels. Similar results are expected for many other resonances at higher masses, e.g. S<sub>11</sub>(1650), F<sub>15</sub>(1685), D<sub>33</sub>(1700), P<sub>13</sub>(1720), ...

> This experiment will – for the foreseeable future – be the only experiment that can provide data on  $\gamma_v NN^*$  electrocouplings for almost all well established excited proton states at the highest photon virtualities ever achieved in N\* studies up to Q<sup>2</sup> of 12 GeV<sup>2</sup>.



#### **Our experimental program seeks to determine**

 $\gamma_v NN^*$  electrocouplings at photon virtualities up to 5.0 GeV<sup>2</sup> for most of the excited proton states through analyzing major meson electro-production channels independently and in global multi- channel analyses.

This information is needed to study the evolution of relevant degrees of freedom in N\* structure with distance and to access the non-perturbative strong interaction which generates N\* states as bound systems of quarks and gluons (see I. G. Aznauryuan et al., Int. J. Mod. Phys. E22, 133015 (2013)).

The non-perturbative strong interaction represents the most important part of the Standard Model that we have yet to explore. These are only known fundamental processes for which relevant degrees of freedom accessible in the measurements can be very different with respect to those entered in the basic QCD Lagrangian.
