## **Vector-meson electroproduction**

rigorous proof of collinear factorization for  $Q^2 \rightarrow \infty$ (Radyushkin (96); Collins et al (97))

hard subprocesses

$$\gamma^*g \to Vg \,, \ \gamma^*q \to Vq$$

and GPDs and meson w.f. (encode the soft physics)



dominant transition  $\gamma_L^* \to V_L$ 

other transitions power suppressed

As compared to DVCS: disadvantage: two soft functions advantages: diff. mesons  $(\rho^0, \phi, \omega, \rho^+, K^{*0}, J/\Psi)$  allow for flavor separation wealth of good data for  $Q^2$  up to  $100 \,{\rm GeV}^2$  and W up to  $180 \,{\rm GeV}$ 

## The $\gamma^* p \to VB$ amplitudes

consider large  $Q^2$ , W and small t; kinematics fixes skewness:  $\xi \simeq \frac{x_{\rm Bj}}{2-x_{\rm Bj}}[1+m_V^2/Q^2] \simeq x_{\rm Bj}/2 + {\rm m.m.c.}$ 

$$\mathcal{M}_{\mu+,\mu+}(V) = \frac{e_0}{2} \left\{ \sum_a e_a \mathcal{C}_V^{aa} \langle H_{\text{eff}}^g \rangle_{V\mu} + \sum_{ab} \mathcal{C}_V^{ab} \langle H_{\text{eff}}^{ab} \rangle_{V\mu} \right\},$$
$$\mathcal{M}_{\mu-,\mu+}(V) = -\frac{e_0}{2} \frac{\sqrt{-t}}{M+m} \left\{ \sum_a e_a \mathcal{C}_V^{aa} \langle E^g \rangle_{V\mu} + \sum_{ab} \mathcal{C}_V^{ab} \langle E^{ab} \rangle_{V\mu} \right\},$$

 $C_V^{ab}$  flavor factors, M(m) mass of B(p),  $H_{eff} = H - \xi^2/(1 - \xi^2)E$ contributions from  $\widetilde{H}$  to T-T amplitude neglected electroproduction with unpolarized protons at small  $\xi$ : E not much larger than H (see below)  $\Longrightarrow H_{eff} \rightarrow H$  for small  $\xi$  $|M_{\mu'-,\mu+}|^2 \propto t/m^2$  neglected  $\Longrightarrow$  probes H (exception  $\rho^+$ ) trans. polarized target: probes  $Im[\langle E \rangle^* \langle H \rangle]$  interference

## The failure of the leading-twist approximation

#### for experimentally accessible $Q^2$

prediction for  $\sigma_L$  exceeds data by a large factor (HERA) power corr. and/or higher orders of pQCD? Diehl-Kugler 07, Ivanov 07

 $R = \sigma_L / \sigma_T$  (HERA)  $\gamma_T^* \to V_T$  non-negligible but in coll. factorization infrared singular power corr. and/or higher twist needed

T-L transition small but non-zero seen in SDME  $r_{00}^5$  (HERMES  $\rho^0$ ) twist-3 nf amplitude  $\mathcal{M}_{0-,++}$ ?  $r_{00}^5 \propto \text{Re}M^*_{0-,0+}M_{0-,++}$ related to helicty-flip GPDs



### **Subprocess amplitudes**



 $\mathcal{H}^{Vab}_{\mu\lambda,\mu\lambda} = \int d\tau d^2 b \,\hat{\Psi}_{V\mu}(\tau,-\vec{b}) \exp[-S(\tau,\vec{b},Q^2)]$  $\times \hat{\mathcal{F}}^{ab}_{\mu\lambda,\mu\lambda}(\bar{x},\xi,\tau,Q^2,\vec{b})$ 

LO pQCD

- + quark trans. mom.
- + Sudakov supp.
- $\Rightarrow$  lead. twist for  $Q^2 \rightarrow \infty$

in collinear appr:

Sudakov factor (Sterman et al)  $S \propto \ln \frac{\ln (\tau Q/\sqrt{2}\Lambda_{\rm QCD})}{-\ln (b\Lambda_{\rm QCD})} + \text{NLL}$   $\hat{\mathcal{F}}$  FT of hard scattering kernel e.g. FT of  $\propto e_a/[k_{\perp}^2 + \tau(\bar{x} + \xi)Q^2/(2\xi)]$ 

regularizes also TT amplitude

 $TT: \int_0^1 d\tau \frac{\Phi_V(\tau)}{\tau} \frac{1}{(1-\tau)t + \tau Q^2}$  IR singular for large  $Q^2$  regular for large -t (wide-angles)

## Numerical results

Goloskokov-K. 06, 07, 08

GPDs constructed from CTEQ6 PDFs through the double distribution ansatz

Gaussian wave fcts for the mesons  $\Psi_{Vj}(\tau, \mathbf{k}_{\perp}) \propto \exp[-a_{Vj}^2 \mathbf{k}_{\perp}^2/(\tau \bar{\tau})]$ 

L an T different, free parameters -  $a_{L,T}^V$  (transverse size  $\langle k_{\perp}^2 \rangle^{1/2} \propto 1/a_{L,T}^V$ )

meson wf. provides effects of order  $\langle k_{\perp}^2 \rangle / Q^2$  separation of both GPDs mainly influence the  $\xi(x_{Bj})$  dependence effects possible

fit to all data from HERMES, COMPASS, E665, H1, ZEUS cover large range of kinematics  $Q^2\simeq 3-100\,{
m GeV}^2$   $W\simeq 5-180\,{
m GeV}$ 

 $\rho^0$  and  $\phi$  cross sections



at  $Q^2 = 4(3.8) \,\mathrm{GeV}^2$  E665 ( $\triangle$ ), HERMES ( $\bullet$ ), CORNELL ( $\blacktriangle$ ) ZEUS ( $\Box$ ), H1 ( $\blacksquare$ ), CLAS ( $\circ$ )

double distribution model too simple for valence quarks for large  $\xi$ ? breakdown of handbag physics? Lacking nucleon resonances? JLAB12 may explore region close to minimum

### Cross sections for $\omega, \rho^+$ and $K^{*0}$



results for HERMES and COMPASS ( $W = 5, 10 \,\text{GeV}$ )  $\rho^0$ ,  $\omega$ ,  $\rho^+$ ,  $K^{*0}$  W dependence controlled by Regge behaviour  $\sigma \propto W^{4(\alpha(0)-1)}$  at fixed  $Q^2$   $\rho^0$ ,  $\omega$ :  $\alpha - 1 = \delta \simeq 0.1$  diffractive (gluon + sea)  $\rho^+$  :  $\alpha - 1 \simeq -0.5$   $K^{*0}$  intermediate valence quark contributions die out quickly with increasing W at small  $\xi$ 

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#### What do we know about E?

analysis of Pauli FF for proton and neutron at  $\xi = 0$  Diehl et al (04):  $F_2^{p(n)} = \int_0^1 dx \left| e_{u(d)} E_v^u(x,\xi=0,t) + e_{d(u)} E_v^d(x,\xi=0,t) \right|$ ansatz for small -t:  $E_v^a = e_v^a(x) \exp\left\{t\left(\alpha' \ln(1/x) + B_a\right)\right\}$ forward limit:  $e_v^a = N_a x^{-\alpha_v(0)} (1-x)^{\beta_v^a}$  (analogously to PDFs)  $N_a$  fixed from  $\kappa_a = \int_0^1 dx E_v^a(x,\xi=0,t=0)$  ( $\kappa_u \simeq 1.67$ ,  $\kappa_d \simeq -2.03$ ) fitting FF data provides:  $\beta_v^u = 4$ ,  $\beta_v^d = 5.6$  (other powers not excluded)  $(G_{E,M}^n \text{ at large } Q^2 \text{ required})$  (upgraded JLab?) sum rule (Ji's s.r. and momentum s.r. of DIS) at  $t = \xi = 0$  $\int_{0}^{1} dx x e_{g}(x) = e_{20}^{g} = -\sum e_{20}^{a_{v}} - 2\sum e_{20}^{\bar{a}}$ valence term very small, in particular if  $\beta_v^u \leq \beta_v^d$  $\Rightarrow$  gluon and sea quark moments cancel each other almost completely positivity bound forbids large sea  $\Rightarrow$  gluon small too parameterization:  $e^{i} = N_{i}x^{-\alpha_{g}(0)}(1-x)^{\beta^{i}}$  (flavor symm. sea for E assumed) input to double distribution model for  $E = (E_v^a \text{ is d.d. model at } \xi = 0)$ 

### Solutions for *E* and Ji's sum rule

$$\langle J^a \rangle = \frac{1}{2} \Big[ q_{20}^a + e_{20}^a \Big] \qquad \langle J^g \rangle = \frac{1}{2} \Big[ g_{20} + e_{20}^g \Big]$$

 $(\xi = 0)$   $\langle J \rangle$  means average value of three component of J

 $J^i$  quoted at scale  $4 \,\mathrm{GeV}^2$  (spread indicates uncertainties of present knowledge)  $\sum J^i = 1/2$ , the spin of the proton characteristic, stable pattern: for all variants  $J^u$  and  $J^g$  are large, others small

#### The first moments at t = 0

for orientation

(assuming that the GPDs have no nodes and similar t dependence)

# **Results for** $A_{UT}(V)$



 $W = 5 \,\mathrm{GeV}$   $Q^2 = 3 \,\mathrm{GeV}$ variant 1, 2, 3, 4



t dependence controlled by trivial factor  $\sqrt{-t'}$ except for  $\rho^+$ : since  $H(E)_v^u - H(E)_v^d$ E non-negligible in cross section, contribution from helicity flip ampl.  $\propto t'$ 

## **Remarks on wide-angle photoproduction**

kinematical requirement  $s, -t, -u \gg m^2 Q^2$  small factorization obtained with assumption of restricted parton virtualities and transverse momenta Huang-K(02), Huang-Jakob-K-Passek(04) work in a symmetric frame (c.m.s. with  $p_3 = p'_3 \Rightarrow \xi = 0$ ) amplitude follows from electroproduction amplitude putting  $\xi = 0$ factorization in hard subprocess amplitudes and 1/x moments of GPDs,i.e. generalized form factors

$$R_{i}^{a}(t) = \int_{0}^{1} \frac{dx}{x} F_{i}^{a}(x,\xi=0,t), \qquad F_{i} = H, \widetilde{H}, E$$

#### Phenomenology of wide-angle photoproduction:

leading-twist, lowest order of pQCD: cross sections too small by order of magnitude in comparison with SLAC data (larger s, -t, -u needed?) ratios like spin correlations (e.g.  $A_{LL}, K_{LL}$ ) may work better  $\pi^-/\pi^+$  ratio OK

# $\pi^-/\pi^+$ ratio

$$\frac{d\sigma(\gamma n \to \pi^- p)}{d\sigma(\gamma p \to \pi^+ n)} = \left(\frac{e_u s + e_d u}{e_u u + e_d s}\right)^2$$

## Summary

- phenomenology of DVME within the handbag approach is complicated, still a lot of work to be done
- cross section at small  $x_{Bj}$  provides information on the GPD H
- GPDs modeled through reggeized double distributions and subprocess calculated within mod. pert. approach few free parameters  $(a_V)$ , essentially for  $T \rightarrow T$  amplitude fair agreement with experiment for  $Q^2 \simeq 3 \dots 100 \,\mathrm{GeV}^2$ ,  $W \simeq 5 \dots 180 \,\mathrm{GeV}$
- E constructed with the help of Pauli FF, sum rules and positivity bounds
- data on  $A_{UT}$  will fix E better and hence details on parton angular momenta
