## Single vs. double scattering



When colliding composite objects, many constituent scatterings "compete" for the collision energy – and multiple scattering can look like single complicated scatterings! Which scattering is the most important?

### Double vs. multiparton scattering



Beam thrust in W+jets event, taken from Les Houches Proc. arXiv:1203.6803. The difference (yellow vs. green) accumlates from many scatterings.

## The dijet process



Perturbative cross section

$$\sigma(pp \to jj + X) = \int_{p_{\perp min}}^{\frac{E_{cm}}{2}} dx_1 dx_2 f_1(x_1) f_2(x_2) \frac{d\hat{\sigma}}{dp_{\perp}} dp_{\perp} > \sigma(pp \to anything) \text{ for } \frac{p_{\perp min}}{E_{cm}} \to 0$$

as f(x) not small (enough) for low  $x \approx \frac{p_{\perp min}}{E_{cm}}$  to suppress  $\frac{p_{\perp min}}{E_{cm}} \to 0$  divergence!

## Hints from factorisation

Still consistent with perturbative QCD: PDFs are the *inclusive* probability to find parton at *x*, with all other interactions above  $x \approx \frac{p_{\perp min}}{E_{cm}}$  integrated out!



#### Multiple interactions (indirect evidence)





FIG. 3. Charged-multiplicity distribution at 540 GeV, UA5 results (Ref. 32) vs simple models: dashed low  $p_T$  only, full including hard scatterings, dash-dotted also including initial- and final-state radiation.

### Multiple interactions ("direct evidence")

### Double parton scattering has typical kinematics...



...that's seen in the data (ATLAS New J.Phys. 15 (2013) 033038)

Multiple scatterings and the inelastic (non-diffractive) cross section

A scattering above  $p_{\perp min}$  is accompanied by an average  $\langle n(p_{\perp min})\rangle$  interactions, so that

$$d\sigma^{inc}(p_{\perp min}, E_{cm}) = \langle n(p_{\perp min}) \rangle \cdot \sigma^{ND}(p_{\perp min}, E_{cm})$$

where

$$\sigma^{\text{ND}} \approx \left(\sigma^{\text{tot}} - \sigma^{el}\right) - \int \left(d\sigma_{\text{SD}} - d\sigma_{\text{DD}} - d\sigma_{\text{CD}}\right)$$
  
 $\sigma^{\text{ND}} < \sigma(pp \rightarrow anything)$ 

is the inelastic non-diffractive cross-section (defined implicitly by total, elastic cross section and diffractive parametrisation).

Now the average number of scatterings is unconstrained, but the (single scattering) cross section remains small enough.

Multiparton interactions from a "consistency condition"

Question: Can't we just overlay many scatterings to approximate the result? Just like we do for Pile-Up? Answer: No!

**Consistency condition:** For large  $p_{\perp}$ , model must preserve the perturbative hard scattering cross section, otherwise factorisation of inclusive cross section violated!

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Solution: Subtract what you add! For every additional scattering, we need "virtual corrections"

(This should sound familiar from parton shower unitarity)





$$\sum \left[ \mathcal{O}(S_H) - \mathcal{O}(S_H) \right] + \int \mathcal{O}(S_H S_{2 \to 2})$$













### If you have a hammer...

... everything looks like a parton shower. Assume

 $\delta p_{\perp} \langle n(p_{\perp}) \rangle \equiv \text{Probability for scattering with } p_{\perp} \in [p_{\perp min}, p_{\perp min} + \delta p_{\perp}].$ 

Then the probability of no scattering is

$$1 - \delta p_{\perp} \langle n(p_{\perp}) \rangle$$

or, if  $\delta p_{\perp}$  is divided into m parts, and the scattering probabilities are independent

$$\left[1 - \delta p_{\perp}/m \langle n(p_{\perp}) \rangle\right]^{m} \underset{m \to \infty}{\rightarrow} \exp\left(-\int_{p_{\perp min}}^{p_{\perp min} + \delta p_{\perp}} dp_{\perp} \langle n(p_{\perp}) \rangle\right) \equiv \Pi^{\mathsf{MPI}}(p_{\perp min} + \delta p_{\perp}, p_{\perp min})$$

We can define a no-additional scattering probability which contains "all-order virtual corrections" – just like a parton shower Sudakov factor.

 $\Longrightarrow$  Can recycle the PS algorithm to produce additional scatterings.

# Scattering probabilities The probability of a hardest scattering at $p_{\perp 1}$ is $\Pi^{MPI}(p_{\perp 0}, p_{\perp 1}) \langle n(p_{\perp 1}) \rangle$

The probability of having a second hardest scattering at  $p_{\perp 2} < p_{\perp 1}$  is

$$\int_{p_{\perp 2}}^{p_{\perp 0}} dp_{\perp 1} \Pi^{\mathsf{MPI}}(p_{\perp 0}, p_{\perp 1}) \langle n(p_{\perp 1}) \rangle \Pi^{\mathsf{MPI}}(p_{\perp 1}, p_{\perp 2}) \langle n(p_{\perp 2}) \rangle$$

...and so on. The probability for any partonic scattering is thus  $\sigma^{inc}$ , i.e. the perturbative result. The double parton scattering cross section is:

$$\begin{split} \langle \mathcal{O} \rangle &= \int d\Phi_{H} \int_{p_{\perp min}}^{p_{\perp 0}} d\Phi_{2 \rightarrow 2} \; d\hat{\sigma}_{H}(\Phi_{H}) d\hat{\sigma}_{2 \rightarrow 2}(\Phi_{2 \rightarrow 2}) \; \mathcal{O}(\Phi_{H} \Phi_{2 \rightarrow 2}) \\ & \frac{1}{\sigma^{ND}} \Pi^{\mathsf{MPI}}(p_{\perp 0}, p_{\perp}) \; f_{0}^{+}(x_{0}^{+}, \mu_{F,0}^{2}) f_{0}^{-}(x_{0}^{-}, \mu_{F,0}^{2}) \; \frac{f_{1}^{+}(\frac{x_{1}^{+}}{1-x_{0}^{+}}, p_{\perp})}{1-x_{0}^{+}} \frac{f_{1}^{-}(\frac{x_{1}^{-}}{1-x_{0}^{-}}, p_{\perp})}{1-x_{0}^{-}} \end{split}$$

Our simplest DPD model. Note rescaled PDF to enforce flavour sum rule.

## The pedestal, or *how entangled are MPI*?



scatterings (trigger blas!)  $\Rightarrow$  Not captured by model where all scatterings have same probability.  $\Rightarrow$  Model matter overlap, i.e. introduce impact parameter dependence.

#### The pedestal, or *how entangled are MPI*?

Redefine the naive scattering as

$$\langle n(p_{\perp}) \rangle \rightarrow \langle n(p_{\perp}) \rangle \cdot \mathcal{A}(b) / \langle \mathcal{A} \rangle$$

The probability for any partonic scattering is still  $\sigma^{\rm inc},$  but the double-parton cross section is now

$$\langle \mathcal{O} \rangle = \int d^2 b \int d\Phi_H \int_{p_{\perp min}}^{p_{\perp 0}} d\Phi_{2 \to 2} \ d\hat{\sigma}_H(\Phi_H) d\hat{\sigma}_{2 \to 2}(\Phi_{2 \to 2}) \ \mathcal{O}(\Phi_H \Phi_{2 \to 2})$$

$$\frac{1}{\sigma^{\text{ND}}} \frac{\mathcal{A}(b)}{\langle \mathcal{A} \rangle} \Pi^{\text{MPI}}(b, p_{\perp 0}, p_{\perp}) \ f_0^+(x_0^+, \mu_{F,0}^2) f_0^-(x_0^-, \mu_{F,0}^2) \ \frac{f_1^+(\frac{x_1}{1-x_0^+}, p_{\perp})}{1-x_0^+} \frac{f_1^-(\frac{x_1}{1-x_0^-}, p_{\perp})}{1-x_0^-}$$

with

$$\Pi^{\mathsf{MPI}}(b, p_{\perp 0}, p_{\perp}) \exp\left(-\frac{\mathcal{A}(b)}{\langle \mathcal{A} \rangle} \int\limits_{p_{\perp}}^{p_{\perp 0}} d\Phi_{2 \to 2} \frac{d\hat{\sigma}_{2 \to 2}(\Phi_{2 \to 2})}{\sigma^{\mathsf{ND}}}\right)$$

## Evolution of proton scattering (w/ PYTHIA bias)

- MPI models infer a model for double-parton distributions. DPDs should evolve (to LL as double DGLAP would?)
  ⇒ Additional scatterings should evolve by parton showering.
- Scatterings are correlated by momentum conservation. Thus, scatterings should evolve together as one big system.
- Formalism of  $p_{\perp}$ -ordered showers and MPI is analogous.

 $\Longrightarrow$  Combine MPI and PS into a single, interleaved evolution equation

$$\begin{aligned} \mathbf{Evol} \left[ in \ state \right] (p_{\perp 0}, p_{\perp c}) \\ &= \mathcal{O} \left( in \ state \right) \exp \left[ - \int_{p_{\perp c}}^{p_{\perp 0}} \left( d\mathcal{P}^{MPI} + d\mathcal{P}^{FSR} + d\mathcal{P}^{ISR} \right) \right] \\ &+ \int_{p_{\perp c}}^{p_{\perp 0}} \left( d\mathcal{P}^{MPI} + d\mathcal{P}^{FSR} + d\mathcal{P}^{ISR} \right) \ \exp \left[ - \int_{p_{\perp 1}}^{p_{\perp 0}} \left( d\mathcal{P}^{MPI} + d\mathcal{P}^{FSR} + d\mathcal{P}^{ISR} \right) \right] \\ &\quad \mathbf{Evol} \left[ new \ state \right] (p_{\perp 1, \perp c}) \end{aligned}$$

## Subdividing MPI into double and single feed terms

PYTHIA 8 further includes rescattering corrections (lower left). This is truely non-factorising (final parton is put back into proton)



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 $\Rightarrow$  Perturbative MPI *model* keeping the inc. cross section. Unknowns:

- $\sigma^{\rm ND}$  depends on  $\sigma^{tot}$ ,  $\sigma^{elast}$  and diffractive model. The parameters of these thus influence MPI.
- Most MPI very soft, but  $\sigma^{inc}$  is still divergent for  $p_{\perp min} \rightarrow 0$ , i.e. needs extra regulator parameter  $p_{\perp 0}$ . Regulator should be larger if  $E_{cm}$  becomes larger (to not violate the total cross section), i.e. get parameters for energy scaling of  $p_{\perp 0}$
- Cut  $p_{\perp c}$  deciding when to convert to hadrons.
- Parameters for matter profile  $\mathcal{A}(b)$ .

MPI models in general-purpose event generators:

**HERWIG**: Pick interactions prior to running according to Poissonian, **SHERPA**: MPI after hard process evolution in a  $p_{\perp}$ -ordered sequence. **PYTHIA**: MPI + ISR + FSR combined in one single  $p_{\perp}$  sequence.

## Summary

- Prediction incomplete before assessing/including non-pert. effects.
- 2 partons  $\rightarrow$  2 partons cross section naively exceeds total cross section.
- Factorisation hints this may be due to additional scatterings.
- Multiparton interaction models attempt to describe hadron-collider data by "resolving" these additional scatterings.
- Models fulfill some consistency conditions, e.g. should yield the inclusive cross section when additinal scattering are integrated out.
- Models come with a handful of parameters.
