"Factorization Violation"

Phrase can mean different things.

The anticipated form for a factorization formula In General: is invalid.

<u>Reasons Factorization could fail:</u>

 \bar{n}

- Measurement doesn't factor: no simple factorization for the functions, or in SCET for the soft and collinear modes. (eg. Jade alg.)
- Hard-Collinear Factorization fails. $H_2, H_3 \simeq \text{back-to-back}$ examples studied by Collins, Qiu, Aybat, Rogers, ... $H_1 + H_2 \rightarrow H_3 + H_4 + X$ SCET: matching fails, cannot find a finite basis of Hard operators.
- **Divergent integrals**, not controlled by usual regulation procedures. (Requires more careful definition of functions.)

More Examples of Factorization Violation

- Violation of Cross Section factorization, for example PDFs entangled (CSS)
- Violation of Collinear Amplitude Factorization (Catani, de Florian, Rodrigo) (Forshaw, Seymour, Siodmok)

Violation of Regge Amplitude Factorization

Goals & Possible Advantages for EFT approach

- Hard Scattering and Forward Scattering in single framework
- Operator based: Can exploit symmetries, Gauge invariant
- MS style renormalization for rapidity divergences (counterterms, renormalization group equations, ...)
- Distinct Infrared Modes in Feyn. Graphs + Power Counting

 \rightarrow

derive when eikonal approximation is relevant

- Factorization violating interactions may also obey factorization theorems
- Valid to all orders in α_s & clear path using this formalism to study subleading power amplitudes (subleading ops & Lagrangians)
- Potential method to derive factorization results for less inclusive collider processes, predict things about UE, etc.

SCET Fields for various Modes





- dominant contributions from isolated regions of momentum space
- use subtractions rather than sharp boundaries to preserve symmetry

Principles used for Soft-Collinear Effective Theory

- Matching
 QCD & SCET must agree at long distances short distance encoded by coefficients, giving H
- Power Counting for fields, states, amplitudes with loops Rigorously track expansions
 Power counting theorems
- Symmetry Gauge symmetry within sectors
 Lorentz & Reparameterization symmetries

Wilson lines generated by integrating out offshell modes

$$W_n = P \exp\left(ig \int_{-\infty}^0 ds \,\bar{n} \cdot A_n(x + \bar{n}s)\right)$$
or

analogous for soft fields

Direction dependence often cancelled by 0-bin subtractions. (Can be fixed considering Glaubers.)

Glaubers are offshell and must be integrated out (despite having $p^2 \sim \lambda^2$)

Otherwise one has problems with simultaneously having gauge invariant operators and homogeneous power counting

One Loop EFT graphs

- QCD topologies will appear more than once (soft, collinear, ...)
- Each dominated by <u>one</u> invariant mass scale & <u>one</u> rapidity
- Require invariant mass regulator (dim.reg.)

Requires rapidity regulator for Glauber potential $~|2k^z|^{-\eta}\nu^\eta$ and for Wilson lines

Use Chiu, Jain, Neill, Rothstein works like MS:

Total SCET = Total QCD $(s \gg t)$

- IR divergences are all reproduced
- ullet no hard matching (no loops with momenta $\sim s$)

offshell lines in loop graphs are always sequestered in tree level subcomponents

Conclusion (so far)

- $\bullet~$ Constructed an EFT for $~s\gg t$, Fwd. Scattering & Fact.Violation
- Universal Operators that can be used for many processes & problems
