Jet vetoes, resummation, and Glauber gluons

Jet vetoes and resummation

- $pp (\rightarrow H) \rightarrow W^+W^-$ at the LHC, e.g., is subject to a **jet veto** that restricts jet p_T to be below $\sim 25 \text{ GeV} \ll$ hard scale $Q \implies$ large logs $\sim \alpha_s^n \log^{2n}(p_T^{\text{veto}}/Q)$.
- **Resummation** relies on factorization. Factorized cross section when $p_T^{\text{veto}} \ll Q$ Stewart, Tackmann, Waalewijn '09; Tackmann, Walsh, Zuberi '12; Becher Neubert '12; Banfi, Monni, Salam, Zanderighi '12

$$\sigma^{\rm veto} = H \times J_1 \times J_2 \times \frac{S}{S} + \mathcal{O}\left(p_T^{\rm veto}/Q\right).$$

Other application: N-jettiness subtraction Gaunt, Stahlhofen, Tackmann, Walsh '15; Boughezal, Focke, Giele, Liu, Petriello '15.

- $J_i \sim$ probability of collinear splitting not producing an identified jet. S ~ probability of soft radiation not producing an identified jet.
- S calculated in the eikonal approximation. Not applicable for Glauber gluons whose momenta are dominated by transverse components.

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Previous examples of factorization violation

- Dijet production with a rapidity gap Forshaw, Kyrielesis, Seymour '06, '08. Single logarithms turn into double logarithms.
- Dijet production with measured hadronic event shapes Banfi, Salam, Zanderighi '10.
- TMD factorization breaks for hadron production. Counter-examples known Colins, Qiu '07 Rogers, Mulders '10.
 Affects resummation of tt production at low pair p_T Li, Li, Shao, Yang, Zhu '13, Catani, Grazzini, Torre '14.
- Certain spin asymmetries, vanishing to all α_s orders under TMD factorization, can become non-zero Rogers '13.

Section 2

Proofs of Glauber gluon cancellation

Glauber cancellation I: e^+e^- and SIDIS

- Standard factorization takes into account the soft, collinear and soft-collinear overlap regions.
- To show that no other IR regions are relevant, need to show

$$\int dl^{+} dl^{-} d^{2} l_{T} \left[l(l) - l_{s}(l) - l_{c}(l) + l_{sc}(l) \right]$$

has no IR divergences.

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- For e⁺e⁻ → j + X and e + p → j + X, l⁺ or l⁻ contours can be deformed to large imaginary values. Only soft & collinear regions left. ⇒ Subtracted integrand above has no IR divergences at any point.
- For the deformation to be successful, *I*, *I*_s, and *I*_c must have the same pole structure ⇒ strong constraints on Wilson line direction and rapidity regularization Collins, Metz '04, Collins '11.

Glauber cancellation II: Drell-Yan (inclusive or with measured pair- p_T)

For Drell-Yan, glauber gluons do not cancel at the amplitude level, but after sum over cuts. Bodwin '85, Collins, Soper, Sterman '85, '88



CSS '88 proof requirements:

- 1. At least one incoming hadron contributes a single massless parton.
- Integrate over k⁺_s and sum over "final state" cuts for soft gluons.
- 3. Integrate over the small momentum components k_A^- , $k_{B\,i}^+$.

Parity and toy model for factorization violation

Failure of Glauber cancellation?

- Jet vetoes break the requirements of the CSS proof. Examined in more details in the context of multi-parton scattering in Gaunt '14.
- Could an unknown new cancellation mechanism exist? Could a "generalized" factorization formula, with non-standard definitions of collinear / soft functions, correctly incorporate Glauber effects?
- We disprove both possibilities by a direct counter-example in QCD with scalar quarks.
- We show that the cross section does not exhibit the enhanced discrete symmetries predicted by factorization. Parity used in our toy model. Charge conjugation could lead to realistic models.

Toy model for factorization violation

■ Model (parity conserving): QCD with massless scalar quarks ϕ/ϕ^* , SU(3)-triplets and electrically charged, which can annihilate into a colorless real heavy scalar Φ . Process: $\gamma + \gamma \rightarrow \Phi + X$.



• Observable: double longtitudinal spin asymmetry

$$\sim \left(\sigma_{\uparrow\downarrow}+\sigma_{\downarrow\uparrow}-\sigma_{\uparrow\uparrow}-\sigma_{\downarrow\downarrow}
ight)/4,$$

in the doubly differential beam thrust distribution (τ_R, τ_L) , with

$$au_R \equiv \sum_{y_i > 0} |k_{iT}| \exp(-|y_i|), \quad au_L \equiv \sum_{y_i < 0} |k_{iT}| \exp(-|y_i|)$$

Discrete symmetries of the toy model

- With or without factorization, Z_2 spin symmetry, $\sigma_{\uparrow\uparrow} = \sigma_{\downarrow\downarrow}$, $\sigma_{\uparrow\downarrow} = \sigma_{\downarrow\uparrow}$. $\sigma_{\uparrow \text{ unpol}} = \sigma_{\downarrow \text{ unpol}}$, i.e. vanishing single spin asymmetry
- With Factorization (standard or generalized), $\sigma \sim H J_1 J_2 S \implies$

double spin asymmetry
$$\sim H\left(J_1^{\downarrow} - J_1^{\uparrow}\right)\left(J_2^{\downarrow} - J_2^{\uparrow}\right)S$$

single spin asymmetry $\sim H\left(J_1^{\downarrow} - J_1^{\uparrow}\right) J_2^{\mathrm{unpol}}S$
=0

- Double spin asymmetry also vanishes, enhanced $Z_2 \times Z_2$ spin symmetry, $\sigma_{\uparrow\downarrow} = \sigma_{\downarrow\uparrow} = \sigma_{\uparrow\uparrow} = \sigma_{\downarrow\downarrow}$. May not hold when Glauber region included.
- A non-zero double spin asymmetry would disprove standard factorization and a wide class of generalizations.

Calculating spin asymmetry in the model

With incoming photons in the $\pm z$ directions, the unpolarized spin sum is

$$(\epsilon^{\mu}_{\downarrow}\epsilon^{\nu}_{\downarrow}+\epsilon^{\mu}_{\uparrow}\epsilon^{\nu}_{\uparrow})/2=g^{\mu_{T}\nu_{T}}/2,$$

while the left-right spin sum asymmetry is

$$(\epsilon^{\mu}_{\downarrow}\epsilon^{\nu}_{\downarrow}-\epsilon^{\mu}_{\uparrow}\epsilon^{\nu}_{\uparrow})/2=i\epsilon^{\mu_{\tau}\nu_{\tau}}/2$$



Vanishing spin asymmetry at LO

Factorizable diagrams, such as the LO diagram, do not contribute.



as expected.

Vanishing non-factorizable diagrams: $\mathcal{O}(\alpha_s)$

Usually, the one-Glauber cut diagram



cancels with its complex conjugate cut diagram. But for our special model, the contribution by itself has zero real and imaginary parts.

$$\begin{split} \mathcal{M}^2 \Big|_{\mathrm{asym}} \propto \int d^4 l \, \epsilon \left(k_1^{\mathsf{T}}, l^{\mathsf{T}} \right) \, \epsilon \left(k_2^{\mathsf{T}}, l^{\mathsf{T}} \right) \\ \times \, \text{denominators,} \end{split}$$

odd under $k_1^T \to R_{IT}(k_1^T)$, while the measurement function (beam thrust) is even. \implies zero after phase space integration.



Vanishing non-factorizable diagrams: $\mathcal{O}(\alpha_s^2)$

Essentially the same argumen shows the vanishing of any diagram with at most one soft or Glauber gluon attached to the lower spectator line.



Vanishing of same-side two-Glauber diagrams



- Total exchanged momentum, *I*, is Glauber-like ⇒ contour integration cuts two lines on the left of the gluons, giving an imaginary contribution.
- To get a real result, need another imaginary contribution from cutting the box subdiagram due to Glauber-like *l*₁.
- Result again $\propto \epsilon(k_1^T, l^T)\epsilon(k_2^T, l^T)$, vanishes after phase space integration.

The only diagram left...

We are left with only one cut diagram at $\mathcal{O}(\alpha_s^2)$, from squaring the one-Glauber diagram.



If the Glauber region gives a non-zero double spin asymmetry, we obtain a contradiction to both standard and generalized factorization.

The two-Glauber diagram

Integrating "+" and "-" loop momentum components by contours,



regions (ultrasoft, Glauber-II).

Final result

The resulting loop & phase space integral in 2D Euclidean space is IR and UV finite. Can be evaluated by Monte Carlo without regularization or subtraction.



Using the Vegas algorithm in CUBA library [Hahn, hep-ph/0509016], with 4.2 million points,

$$\left(\frac{d^3\sigma_{\text{asym}}}{d\tau_R d\tau_L dy} / \frac{d^3\sigma_{unpol}}{d\tau_R d\tau_L dy}\right)_{y=0,\tau_R=\tau_L=\tau_B/2\ll 1} = (1.58\pm0.02)C_F^2\alpha_s^2 \neq \mathbf{0}$$

- Counter-example to factorization (standard or generalized), by showing the violation of $Z_2 \times Z_2$ enhanced spin symmetry predicted by factorization.
- Applicable to both Abelian and non-Abelian theories.
- Due to special numerator structure, Glauber region well defined without IR / rapidity regularization or overlap subtraction. Not generally true!
- It has been proposed that the Glauber contribution can be minimized by using a jet algorithm with small R [Gangal, Stahlhofen, Tackmann, '14].

We do not seem to confirm this, since most of the diagrams are insensitive to R, though real emission diagrams deserve further scrutiny.

Discussion (cont.)

- Charge conjugation symmetry may be used to construct realistic examples that can be tested at colliders.
- The gluon beam functions from p and \bar{p} are the same, leading to the same $gg \rightarrow H$ beam thrust distributions from pp and $p\bar{p}$ collisions. Does $Z_2 \times Z_2$ charge conjugation symmetry survive glauber effects?



• Worth exploring Glauber corrections to preturbative resummation.

The one-Glauber diagram at leading power



The $A\phi\phi^*$ vertices give $\sim 4(p_2 - k).(p_1 - k)$, indep. of *I* at leading power.

■ $l^2 \sim l_T^2$. Only the upper fermion propagators depend on l^+ . Only the lower fermion propagators depend on l^- .

The one-Glauber diagram at leading power



The $A\phi\phi^*$ vertices give $\sim 4(p_2 - k).(p_1 - k)$, indep. of *I* at leading power.

- $l^2 \sim l_T^2$. Only the upper fermion propagators depend on l^+ . Only the lower fermion propagators depend on l^- .
- Can perform I⁺ and I⁻ integrals by contours, picking up poles from cutting two lines.

Squaring the one-Glauber diagram

 I^+ and I^- contour integrals turn 4D pentagon into 2D Euclidean triangle

$$\mu_{2T} \underbrace{ \begin{array}{c} \mu_{2} \\ \mu_{2T} \\ \mu_{1T} \\ \mu_{1T} \\ \mu_{1T} \\ \mu_{1} \end{array} }_{p_{1}} \left(\sum_{l=1}^{p_{2}-k_{2}} \left(\sum_{l=1}^{p_{2}-k_{2}} \frac{1}{|l|^{2}} \frac{k_{1}^{\mu_{1}T} - l^{\mu_{1}T}}{|k_{1}T - l|^{2}} \frac{k_{2}^{\mu_{2}T} + l^{\mu_{2}T}}{|k_{2}T + l|^{2}} \right)$$

Double spin asymmetry

$$\epsilon_{\mu_{1T}\nu_{1T}}\epsilon_{\mu_{2T}\nu_{2T}}\mathcal{M}_{1}^{\mu_{1T}\mu_{2T}}\mathcal{M}_{1}^{*\nu_{1T}\nu_{2T}} \propto \int d^{2}I_{A} \int d^{2}I_{B}$$

$$\epsilon \left(k_{1}^{T} - I_{A}, k_{1}^{T} - I_{B}\right) \epsilon \left(k_{2}^{T} + I_{A}, k_{2}^{T} + I_{B}\right) \times - \prec \left(k_{1}^{T} + k_{2}^{T} + k_{2}^{T}\right)$$

$$\rightarrow 0 \text{ as } I_{A}, I_{B} \rightarrow 0, \text{ suppresses lower-}p_{T} \text{ re-}$$

 \rightarrow 0 as I_A , $I_B \rightarrow$ 0, suppresses lower- p_T regions (ultrasoft, Glauber-II) and their overlap with Glauber region.

2D ϕ^3 diagram
